How it works:

- Eligible customers are identified by their Personal Oncology Nurse Advocate and offered access to the Leal Health program.
- An email is sent with a unique invitation link that allows customers to self-enroll in the Leal portal.
- Customers receive personalized clinical trial match reports, which they can share with oncologists, care teams, and family/caregivers.

Why it matters:

- Ethnic and racial minority groups are significantly underrepresented in trials.³
- Narrow or complex eligibility criteria can be confusing.
- Physicians may not discuss trials.
